

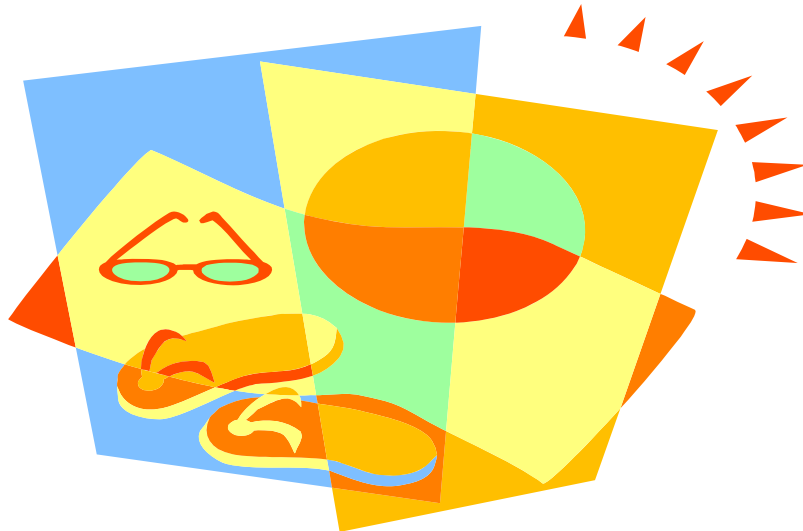


### SMS "TOP SCHOOL"

## Letter from the Principal:

Thank you to the SMS students, faculty, staff, and parents for a wonderful first year as principal! I have thoroughly enjoyed the year and getting to know the students. The students are among the most courteous, well-behaved, and academically-focused that I have experienced as an educator. Additionally, SMS has some of the most talented, dedicated, and professional faculty and staff I have had the privilege to work with. I look forward to having the opportunity next year to continue the good work that has been accomplished this year. As a reminder, there are several options for middle grade students for academic activities this summer. As a Title I school, SMS is offering a free summer school to a total of 80 SMS students in the 6<sup>th</sup> through 8<sup>th</sup> grades that have been identified as academically struggling based on Galileo and AIMS reading and math scores. SMS summer school will run from 8:00am-1:00pm, Mondays through Thursdays from June 1-17; however, bus transportation is not provided. Another option for 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> grade SMS students that live in the Sopori School area is to attend the free summer school at Sopori School, which is also a Title I school. The Sopori summer school will run from 8:00-11:00am, Mondays through Thursdays from June 1-17. Bus transportation is available to and from the Sopori summer school for students living in the Sopori School area. Free breakfast and lunch will also be provided through the local food bank at both SMS and Sopori summer schools. For middle grade students that are not struggling academically but wish to attend summer school to help them retain what they have learned throughout the year and curb the loss of learning that typically occurs during the summer months, Anza Trail School is offering a fee-based summer school from 8:00am-12:00pm, Mondays through Thursdays from June 2-29. There is no transportation or lunch provided at the Anza Trail summer school, and the fee is \$240.
